

Did you know there is a transportation stipend being offered for Educational Choice in Florida by Step Up for Students? This includes transporting your child to a charter school!

Every child has unique needs and sometimes the best school may be one other than the one he/she is assigned. To support the transportation costs associated with traveling to a different public school than the one the student has been assigned, families of K-8 students can benefit from a transportation stipend of \$750 per eligible household, regardless of income.


ATTENDANCE MATTERS! BE HERE! ON TIME! EVERY DAY! ALL DAY!



Summer break is always an exciting time for teens. But it can also be very dangerous as they begin to spend more and more time on the roadways.

Over the past five years, nearly 3,500 people have been killed in crashes involving teen drivers during the 100 Deadliest Days of Summer, the period between Memorial Day and Labor Day.*

As a result, nearly two-thirds of people injured or killed in a crash involving a teen driver are people other than the teen behind the wheel.

Talk. Teach. Plan.

To keep the roadways safer this summer, AAA encourages parents to:



Speak with your teen early and often about driving responsibly and abstaining from dangerous behavior behind the wheel.



Teach by example. Drive just as carefully as you want your child to drive, and avoid risky behavior when you're in the driver's seat.



Emphasize that safe driving is smart driving by completing AAA's parent-teen driving agreement to set family rules for your teen driver.
